# God is Holy, Righteous & True & Sanctified He cannot ever go against that nature.

- God is ABLE to make Grace abound toward you (2 Cor 9:8)
- God's goodness, forbearance, long-suffering LEADS to repentance(Rom 2:4)



- ...for I the Lord your God who sanctify/consecrate you am holy (Lev 21:8)
- God is a JUST God & Savior (Is 45:21)
- God is a JUST judge (Psalm 7:11)
- ....for the Lord our God is holy. (Ps 99:9)
- And you shall not profane My holy name, but I will be sanctified among the sons of Israel; I am the Lord who sanctifies you (Lev 22:32)
- For the word of the Lord is right, and all His work is done in truth. He loves righteousness and justice; The earth is full of the goodness of the Lord. Ps 33:5
- Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable as His judgements and His ways past finding out! (Rom 11:33)

#### Man is unrighteous because of sin.

- ...just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus spread to all men, because all sinned (Rom 5:12)
- Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness. (1 John 3:4)
- ...Whoever sins has neither seen Him nor known Him....whoever sins is from the devil, for the devils has sinned from the beginning. (1 John 3:5, 8a)
- All have fallen short of the Glory of God (Rom 3:23)
- ...holiness, without which no one will see God (Heb 12:14)
- Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God?...(1 Cor 6:9-11)
- The wages of sin is death (Rom 6:23)

## Why Be Holy?

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- Because it is written, "Be holy, for I am holy" 1 Peter 1:16
- for this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our savior, who desire all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. 1 Tim 2:3-4





## How can a man be holy?

- ...these things I write to you, so the you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. And <u>He himself is the propitiation for our sins</u>, and not for ours only but also for the whole world. (1 John 2:1-2)
- But <u>God demonstrated his love for us</u>, that <u>while we were still sinners</u>, <u>Christ died for us</u>... having been <u>justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him</u> (Rom 5:8-9)
- For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might <u>become the righteousness of</u> <u>God in Him.</u> (2 Cor 5:21)
- I am the way, the truth and the life. <u>No one comes</u> to the Father except through Me. (John 14:6)
- For there is one God and one <u>Mediator</u> between God and men, the Man <u>Christ Jesu</u>s who gave himself as a ransom for all...(1 Tim 2:5-6)
- This is a faithful saying and worth of all acceptance, <u>that Christ Jesus came into the world to</u> <u>save sinners...</u> (1 Tim 1:16)
- ...that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that he was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures and He was seen by Cephas and then by the twelve. After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once... (1 Cor 15:3-6)



## Do men have to do anything to receive this Justification?


- if we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we <u>confess our sins</u>, He is <u>faithful and just to forgive our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness</u>.
   (1 John 1:8-9)
- that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith... (Eph 3:17)
- He who <u>believes and is baptized will be saved</u>; but he who does not believe will be condemned. (Mark 16:16)
- that if you <u>confess with your mouth</u> the Lord Jesus and <u>believe in your heart</u> that God has raised him from the dead, <u>you will be saved</u>. For with the heart one <u>believes unto</u> <u>righteousness</u>, and with the mouth <u>confession is made unto salvation</u>. (Rom10:8-9)
- ...<u>Repent, and let everyone of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of</u> sins; and you shall <u>receive the gift of the Holy Spirit</u>. (Acts 2:38)



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# How Does this work? Grace through Faith = Legal Justification



- Being justified freely <u>by</u> His grace <u>through</u> the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God set forth as a propitiation <u>by</u> His blood, <u>though</u> faith, to demonstrate His righteousness, because in His forbearance God passed over the sins that were previously committed, to demonstrate at the present time His righteousness, that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. (Rom 3:26)
- For if when we were enemies we were <u>reconciled</u> to God <u>through</u> the death of His son, much more, having been reconciled, we <u>shall be saved</u> by His life. (Rom 5:10)
- For <u>by</u> grace you have been saved <u>though</u> faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the <u>gift</u> of God (Eph 2:8)
- ...God from the beginning chose you for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth (2 The 2:13)
- But when the kindness and the Love of God our Savior toward man appeared, not by works of
  righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy, He saved us, <u>though</u> the
  washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us
  abundantly <u>though</u> Jesus Christ our Savior, that having <u>been justified</u> by His grace we should
  become heirs according to the <u>hope</u> of eternal life. (Titus 3:-7)
- ...But you <u>were washed</u>, but you <u>were sanctified</u>, but you <u>were justified in</u> the name of the Lord Jesus and <u>by</u> the Spirit of our God. (1 Cor 6:11)
- <u>sanctified</u> by God the Father, and <u>preserved</u> in Jesus Christ (Jude 1: 1)
- For we have been <u>sanctified</u> through the <u>offering</u> for the body Jesus Christ once for all (Heb 10:10)

And now I commend you to God and to the <u>word of His grace</u>, which is able to <u>build you up</u> and <u>give you an inheritance among all who are sanctified.</u> (Acts 20:30)

- And every man who has this hope in Him <u>purifies himself</u>, just as He is pure. (1 John 3:3)
- knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but <u>by faith</u> in Jesus Christ, even we <u>have believed</u> in Christ Jesus, that we might <u>be justified by faith in Christ</u> and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified. (Gal 2:16)

## How then shall we live?



- For the love of Christ compels us, because we judge thus: that if One died for all, then all died; and He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again. (2 Cor 5:14-15)
- if indeed you heard Him and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus: that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness. (Eph 4:21-24)
- For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light. (Eph 5:8, 10-11)
- I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I life by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. (Gal 2:20)
- By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. But whoever has this worlds goods, and sees his brother in need, and shuts up his heart from him, how does the love of God abide in Him? My children let us not love in word or tongue, but in deed and in truth. And by this we know that we are of truth, and shall assure our hearts before Him. (1 John 3:16-19)
- Therefore we make it our aim, whether present or absent, to be well pleasing to Him. (2 Cor 5:9)
- And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. (Rom 12:2)
- And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves through out the time of your stay here in fear; knowing you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver and gold, from your aimless conduct which you received from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot. He was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you who through Him believed in God, who raised him from the dead and have Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. (1 Peter 1:17-21)

# Living in Righteousness

- To do righteousness and justice is more acceptable to the LORD than sacrifice (Prov 21:3)
- who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might <u>live</u> <u>for righteousness</u>— by whose stripes you were healed. (1 Peter2:24)



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- Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into
  His death? Therefore we were buried with Him <u>through baptism into death</u>, that just as Christ
  was raised from the dead by the Glory of the Father, even so we <u>should walk in newness of life</u>.
  For if we have been united together in the likeness of His resurrection, knowing this, that our
  old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should
  no longer be slaves of sin. For he who has died has been freed from sin. (Rom 6:3-7)
- And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as <u>instruments of righteousness to God</u> (Rom6:13)
- ... so now present your members as <u>slaves of righteousness for holiness</u> (Rom 6:19)
- Therefore if anyone <u>cleanses</u> himself from the latter(dishonor), he will be a <u>vessel for honor</u>, <u>sanctified</u> and useful to the master, prepared for every good work. Flee also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart. (2 Tim 2:21)
- Yet the <u>righteous</u> will hold to his way, and he who has <u>clean hands will be stronger and stronger</u> (Job 17:9)
- Whoever abides in Him does not sin... Little children, let no one deceive you. He who <u>practices</u> <u>righteousness</u> is righteous, just as He is righteous.... For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil. Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he cannot sin, because he has been born of God(1 John 3:6a, 7, 8b, 9)

# Living in Holiness



- I beseech you therefore brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies as a <u>living sacrifice, holy, acceptable</u> to God, which is your reasonable service. (Rom 12:1)
  - Therefore gird up the <u>loins of your mind</u>, be <u>sober</u>, and rest your <u>hope fully upon the grace</u> that is to be brought to you at the <u>revelation of Jesus Christ</u>; as <u>obedient</u> children, <u>not conforming</u> yourselves to your former lusts as in your ignorance; but as he who called you is holy, you also <u>be holy in all your conduct</u>. (1 Peter 1:15)
  - ...<u>be diligent</u> to be found in Him peace, <u>without spot</u> and <u>blameless</u> (2 Peter 3:14)

## Walking in Light



- Walk as children of light... f<u>inding out what is acceptable to the Lord</u>. And have <u>no fellowship</u> with the <u>works</u> of darkness, but rather expose them. (Eph 5:8b-10-11)
- In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. (John 1:4)
- If we say we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we <u>lie</u> and do not practice the truth. but if we walk in the light as He is the light, we have <u>fellowship</u> with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin. (1 John 1:6-7)

<u>Your word</u> is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path ... The entrance of <u>Your words gives</u> <u>light</u>; It gives <u>understanding</u> to the simple. (Psalm 119:105, 130)

- ... "is a lamp brought to be put under a basket or under a bed? Is it not to be set on a lamp stand? ... If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear. Then He said to them, "take heed what you hear. With the same measure you <u>use it</u>, it will be measured to you; and to you <u>who hear, more</u> <u>will be given (Mark 4:21, 23-5)</u>
- For it is the God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. (2 Cor 4:6)
- But you are a <u>chosen generation</u>, a <u>royal priesthood</u>, a <u>holy nation</u>, His <u>own special people</u>, <u>that</u> <u>you may proclaim</u> the <u>praises</u> of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light. (1 Peter 2:9)

# Walking in Wisdom

• <u>Walk in wisdom</u> toward those who are <u>outside</u>, <u>redeeming</u> the time. Let your speech always be with <u>grace</u>, seasoned with <u>salt</u>, that you may know how to answer each one. (Col 4:5-6)





- But we speak the <u>wisdom of God in a mystery</u>, the hidden wisdom which God ordained before
  the ages for our glory which none of the rulers of this age knew; for had they known, they would
  not have crucified the Lord of Glory.... But God has <u>revealed them to us through His Spirit</u>. For
  the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. ... no one knows the things of God
  except the Spirit of God. (1 Cor 2:7-8, 10, 11b)
- ...that I should preach among the gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, and to make all see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the ages has been hidden in God who created all things through Jesus Christ to the intent that now the manifold wisdom of God might be made known by the church to the principalities, and powers in the heavenly places, according to the eternal purpose which He accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through faith in Him. (Eph 3:8-12)
- See that you <u>walk circumspectly</u>, not as fools but <u>wise</u>, <u>redeeming</u> the time, because the days are evil. (Eph 5:15)
- Therefore do not be unwise, but <u>understand what the will of the Lord is.</u> (Eph 5:17)
- Behold I send you out as sheep in the midsts of wolves. Therefore be <u>wise as serpents</u> and <u>harmless as doves</u> (Matt 10:16)

## Walking in the Spirit

- For as many are <u>led by</u> the Spirit of God, <u>these are the sons of God</u>. ... The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are Children of God (Rom 8:14, 16)
- Do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be <u>filled with the Spirit</u> speaking to one another in psalms, and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making <u>melody</u> in your heart to the Lord, giving <u>thanks</u> for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another in the fear of God. (Eph 5:18-21)
- Do not quench the Spirit (1 Thes 5:19)
- But the <u>fruit of the Spirit</u> is love, joy, peace, long-suffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against Such there is no law. And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live in the spirit, let us also <u>walk in the Spirit</u>. (Gal 5:22-25)
- There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not according to the flesh, but <u>according to the Spirit</u>. (Rom 8:1)
- All things are lawful for me, but not all things are helpful. All things are lawful for me but I will not be brought under the power of any. (1 Cor 6:12)
- For those who live according to the flesh <u>set their minds</u> on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things <u>of the Spirit</u>. (Rom 8:5)
- But if you are not in the flesh but <u>in the Spirit</u>, if indeed <u>the Spirit of God dwells in you</u>. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ he is not His. And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but <u>the Spirit is life because of righteousness</u>. (Rom 8:9-10)
- Nevertheless <u>when</u> one <u>turns</u> to the Lord, the veil is taken away. <u>Now the Lord is the Spirit</u>; and <u>where</u> the Spirit of the Lord is, there is <u>liberty</u>. But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the <u>glory of the Lord</u>, are <u>being transformed</u> into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord. (2 Cor 3:16-18)
- But he who is joined to the Lord is <u>one spirit with Him.</u> Or do you not know that your body is the <u>temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you</u>, who you have from God, and <u>you are not your own</u>? For you were bought at a price; therefore <u>glorify</u> God in your <u>body</u> and in your <u>spirit</u>, <u>which are</u> <u>God's</u> (1 Cor 6:17, 19-20)
- ...eagerly <u>waiting</u> for the adoption, the redemption of our body. For we are <u>saved in</u> this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we eagerly wait for it <u>with</u> perseverance. Likewise the <u>Spirit also helps</u> in <u>our weakness</u>. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself <u>makes intercession</u> for us with groaning which cannot be uttered. Now He who searches the hearts knows the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints <u>according to</u> the will of God. (Rom 8:23b-27)



# How does all of this happen is My Hard Work or the Holy Spirit?



• Since you <u>have purified</u> your souls <u>in obeying</u> the truth <u>through the Spirit</u> in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart, having <u>been born again</u>, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, though the word of God which lives and abides forever (1 Peter 1:22-23)

- Do <u>not grieve the Holy Spirt of God, by whom</u> you were <u>sealed</u> for the day of redemption. (Eph 4:30)
- for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness & truth (Eph 5:9)
- being very confident of this very thing that <u>He who has begun a good work</u> in you <u>will complete</u> <u>it until the day of Jesus Christ;</u> (Phil 1:6)
- being <u>filled</u> with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God. (Phil 1:11)
- And this is His commandment: that we should believe on the name of His Son Jesus Christ and love one another, as He gave us commandment. Now he who<u>keeps</u> His commandments <u>abides in Him</u>, and <u>He in him</u>. And <u>by this we know</u> that He abides in us, <u>by the Spirit</u> whom He has given us. (1 John 3:23-24)
- that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be <u>strengthened</u> with <u>might</u> <u>through</u> the Holy Spirit in the <u>inner man</u> (Eph 3:16)

## **Glorification & Everlasting Life**



For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be <u>conformed to the image of His Son</u>, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. Moreover those whom He <u>predestined</u>, these also He <u>called</u>; whom He called, these He also <u>Justified</u>; and whom He justified, these He also <u>glorified</u>. (Rom 8:30)

- in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, all the dead will rise incorruptible, and <u>we shall be changed</u> (1 Cor 15:52)
- But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead <u>dwells</u> in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through <u>His Spirit who dwells</u> in you. (Rom 8:11)
- but now it has been <u>revealed</u> by the <u>appearing</u> of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has <u>abolished</u> death and brought <u>life</u> and <u>immortality</u> to light though <u>the gospel (2 Tim 1:10)</u>
- Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has <u>not yet been revealed</u> what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, <u>we shall be like Him</u>, for we shall see Him as He is. (1 John 3:2)
- and if children, then heirs—<u>heirs of God</u> and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be <u>glorified</u> together. (Rom 8:17)
- But now having been <u>set free from sin</u>, and having become <u>slaves of God</u>, you have your <u>fruit to</u> <u>holiness</u>, and the end, everlasting life (Rom 6:22)
- But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burnt up. ... looking for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be dissolved, being on fire, the elements will melt with fervent heat? Nevertheless we we, <u>according to his promise</u> look for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells (2 Peter 3:10, 12-13)
- For <u>our citizenship is in heaven</u>, from which we also <u>eagerly wait</u> for the Savior the Lord Jesus Christ who will <u>transform</u> our lowly body that it may be conformed <u>to His glorious</u> body according to the working by which He is able to even subdue all things to Himself. (Phil 3:20-21)
- As for me, I will see Your face in righteousness; I shall be <u>satisfied when</u> I awake in your likeness (Psalm 17:15)
- Surely the <u>righteous</u> shall give <u>thanks</u> to Your name; <u>the upright shall dwell in your presence</u>. (Ps 140:13)
- Lord, who may abide in <u>Your tabernacle</u>? Who may dwell in <u>your holy hill</u>? He who <u>walks</u> <u>uprightly</u>, and <u>works righteousness</u>, and <u>speaks the truth in his heart</u>. He who does <u>not</u> backbite with his tongue, <u>nor</u> does evil to his neighbor, <u>Nor</u> does he take up reproach against his friend. In <u>whose eyes</u> a vile person is disposed, but he <u>honors those who fear the Lord</u>; He who <u>swears</u> to his own hurt and <u>does not change</u>; He who does <u>not</u> put out money at usury, <u>nor</u> does he take a bribe against the innocent. He who does these things <u>shall never be moved</u>. (Ps 15:1-3)

## Do we have any responsibilities or directives required of us?



Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a <u>new creation</u>; Old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. Now all things are <u>of God</u>, who <u>has reconciled us to Himself through</u> <u>Jesus Christ</u>, and has <u>given us the ministry of reconciliation</u>, that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. Now then <u>we are ambassadors for Christ</u>, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. (2 Cor 5:17-21)

- Be <u>diligent</u> to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. (2 Tim 2:15)
- And He said unto them, "<u>Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who</u>
   <u>believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be</u>
   <u>condemned."</u> (Mark 16:15-16)
- Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all the things that I have commanded you; and lo I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Amen (Matthew 28:19-20)
- Therefore I <u>endure all things</u> for the sake of the <u>elect</u>, that they also may <u>obtain the salvation</u> <u>which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.</u> (2 Tim 2:10)
- ... be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus (2 Tim 2:1)
- ...I declare to you <u>the gospel</u> which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand, but which you also are saved, <u>if you hold fast that word which I preached to you</u>—unless you believed in vain. (1 Cor 15:1-2)
- You must therefore endure hardships as a good soldier of Jesus Christ (2 Tim 2:4)
- Therefore, my beloved brethren, be <u>steadfast</u>, <u>immovable</u>, always abounding in <u>the work of the</u> <u>Lord</u>, knowing that your <u>labor is not in vain</u> in the Lord. (1 Cor 15:58)
- All <u>scripture</u> is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for <u>doctrine</u>, for <u>reproof</u>, for <u>correction</u>, for <u>instruction</u> in <u>righteousness</u>, that the man of God may <u>be complete</u>, <u>thoroughly</u> <u>equipped for every good work.</u> (2 Tim 3:16-17)

## Warnings

- hold fast to the gospel -unless you believed in vain (1 Cor 15:1-2)
- "The Lord knows those whose are His" & "Let everyone who names the name of Christ depart from iniquity"...in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay and some for honor and some for dishonor. Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter (dishonor), he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work. (2 Tim 2:16-17)



- He who does not love, does not know God, for God is love. (1 John 4:8)
- Do you not know that the <u>unrighteous</u> will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived... (1 Cor 6:9)
- <u>They went out from us</u>, but they were <u>not of us</u>; for is they had been of us; they would have continued with us; but they went out that they might be made manifest, that none of them were of us (1 John 2:19)

## Words for Sanctified Gospel Graphic

God is Holy. Man is sinful. They cannot associate unless a change occurs. God provides a way through Grace Grace is sending His Son as propitiation for our sins

- Man Hears & Believes the Grace story from the Bible.
- Belief is for the purpose of/or for being put into righteousness
- Understanding Grace = confessing that Jesus is THE Christ
- The Person with Faith is Justified through confessing Jesus is Lord
- The Person with Faith has Jesus dwelling in their heart
- Understanding Grace = gives way to repentance of sin
- True Faith compels the desire for Sanctification which is interactive with baptism.
- Sanctification is only available though the sacrificial blood of Christ.
- Sanctification is a setting apart to be properly used as the Maker intends and is a pre-requisite and a post-requisite with baptism.
- Sanctified people have an inheritance in the Future Eternal Kingdom of God.
- Baptism/Washing is the effective agent that allows for the Holy Spirt of God to regenerate a man's soul
- Regeneration of the soul allows for the Holy Spirit to renew the man's heart continuously.
- A Regenerated person is Righteous. Only the Righteous can enter the Kingdom of Heaven.
- Living in a righteous manner leads into/or is for the purpose of Holiness
- Holy Living the process of serving God conforming to Christlikeness and aiming at being blameless in God's eyes by being obedient to His word.
- This includes walking in the Light, which is the Light of Jesus shown to us from scripture and convicted to us by the Holy Spirit, avoiding fellowship with the works of darkness. It also comes with a promise that is we share the light of Jesus more will be given to us.
- Living in God's Light includes being part of the Royal Priesthood, and our responsibility is to proclaim God's praises.
- As part of the Royal Priesthood we have a responsibility to Walk in Wisdom.
- Walking in Wisdom means carefully and effectively sharing the gospel with the unsaved as led by the Spirit.
- To be led by the Spirit we must be Walking in the Spirit.
- Those that walk in the spirit are the sons of God.
- Walking in the Spirit includes, praise, interacting with other Christians, developing the fruits of the spirit, keeping your mind focused on the things of the Lord and not the world.
- To be walking in the spirit fully is fully submitting to the slavery we willingly subject ourselves to, to be used as God sees fit, to bring about the will of the Lord, which is bring as many to Him as will come.

- Christendom likes to argue if we do the work or the holy spirit.
- The Holy Spirt & God do all the changing work, however, it is clear we must abide in him, defined as keeping God's words, in order to the in the position to receive the changes.
- The Hope, referenced much by Paul is a one word summary of the Glorification and Everlasting Life we have faith will occur at the end of this early version of life.
- Heaven is only for the righteous, who walk uprightly, do "works" of righteousness, and speak truth in their heart.
- Our glorification is a change in that we will have immortality, the same type of body as Christ, and changed in temperament to be who we were created to be without the aggravations of the surrounding sin of the world.
- Those with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, will be raised from the dead and our total bodies will be given everlasting life.
- As faithful Christians we become heirs of God, and ave an eternal inheritance in a New Heavens and a New Earth
- The righteous will see God
